

Our Mission and Philosophy

Early childhood is a time for happy and carefree days, with ample time to play, learn, and grow. In keeping with the command of Christ to “Let the children come to me, do not hinder them; for to such belongs the Kingdom of God” (Mark 10:14), and in keeping with the constitution of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church “to administer to the religious instruction of youth,” Good Shepherd has established a Christian preschool to provide a joyful, loving environment, to build a spiritual frame of reference for living, and to create a ground work for their further education.

Program Description

Our program is designed to provide spiritual, physical, mental, and social experiences at the developmental level of the preschool child. Activities are Christ-centered, showing God’s love and guidance in all areas of Christian living. The program is flexible and varied, encouraging experimentation and creativity.

Non-Discrimination Statement

The Good Shepherd’s Little Lambs Preschool admits children of any race, religion, color, gender, and national or ethnic origin and gives to each all the rights, privileges, programs, and other activities of the preschool.

Our Goals

To provide children with the opportunity to:

- Develop a personal relationship with Jesus Christ.
- Acquire basic Bible knowledge.
- Develop social skills based on a Christian value system.
- Have an introduction to basic academic concepts.
- Develop self-respect, self-worth, and self-understanding.
- Develop independence, self-motivation, and a positive attitude.
- Develop and use the senses in learning processes.
- Develop large and small muscle coordination.
- Recognize the uniqueness of him / her and others.

Curriculum Goals

To accomplish these goals, our staff will:

- Provide a rich variety of independent and small group activities that stimulate the child's thinking and learning.
- Structure the classroom so the child learns from the other children as well as from the teacher.
- Provide interesting information and materials that represent the physical and social world.
- Provide interesting information about the physical and social world so the child will be motivated to learn more.
- Model the use of academic skills (reading, math, etc.) so the child sees purpose in the process of acquiring these skills.
- Provide a learning environment that encourages active experimentation.

Curriculum Areas

Spiritual Growth

Providing the child with the opportunity to develop a personal relationship with Jesus Christ through the Word of God and grow in the Christian faith. Activities include Bible stories, songs, prayers, and worship times.

Communication

Preparing the child for oral and written communication through basic communication skills of speaking, listening, repeating, and recall.

Academic Readiness

Preparing the child for reading, writing, mathematical and scientific awareness through exposure to relating symbols to abstractions, providing a print rich environment, engaging in mathematical concepts and relations, and providing experiences to foster an appreciation for learning.

Social / Emotional

Activities designed to acquaint the child with the uniqueness of each individual person and the people around them. Experiences to gain an appreciation and understanding of nature, conservation, and the world around him / her.

Motor Skills

Activities provided to promote the development of fine and gross motor skills and coordination with tactile discrimination.

Fine Arts

Songs, rhythmic activities, and creative movement along with exposure to different medium for crafting work and creating works of art through the process of exploration designed to make the child aware and sensitive to the sounds and sights that surround him / her.

Play / Centers

Play is an important way for the child to learn. All curriculum areas are incorporated into their play / centers time throughout the day and year. Meaningful learning occurs through the opportunity and experimentation of free play / centers that increases their awareness, skills, creativity, and understanding of their environment.

General Information

A. Enrollment & Registration Policy

1. Children must be 2 ½ on or before August 31st to be enrolled in the 2-day preschool class; age 4 by December 31st to be in the 3-day preschool class; and age 4 on or before August 31st to be in the Jr. K program with the intent to attend kindergarten the following year.
2. Child must be toilet trained, *except for 2-day preschool.*

Forms must be in by child's first day of school. Requirements include:

1. A signed registration / health form for each child.
2. Waiver and liability form.
3. A copy of required state immunizations.
4. A **nonrefundable registration and supply fee** of \$175.00

B. Tuition

Tuition is due on the first day of class each month, starting in September. A **\$25.00 late fee will be charged after the 10th of each month**, unless otherwise prearranged. (Please speak with director in advance.)

Tuition costs:

Preschool 2 day: \$1,980.00 per year or \$220.00 per month for nine months.
Preschool 3 day: \$2,925.00 per year or \$325.00 per month for nine months.
Jr. K 3 day: \$3375.00 per year or \$375.00 per month for nine months.
Jr. K 5 day: \$4,950.00 per year or \$550.00 per month for 9 months.

- * Discuss with the director any special circumstances concerning payments.
- * Pay with cash, check, or money order. Cash will be accepted if exact and given in an envelope clearly marking what it is for and who it is from.
- * Checks must be made payable to: **Good Shepherd Lutheran Church**.
- * Online payments through the web site are available.
- * 30-day delay in payment may result in suspension.
- * ***Tuition is figured on a yearly basis and is not refundable for absences, family vacations, school closures due to weather, scheduled holidays.***
- * **Discounts:**
 - If tuition is paid in full by September 10, 2025, a discount applies.
 - 10% discount for 2nd child's tuition. A 3rd sibling will receive 15% off.
- * The fee for returned checks will be \$25.00.

D. School Closure Policy

In case of inclement weather, follow the Tacoma School District closures that are announced on the radio for full day closures. If schools are two hours late, we will meet one hour later, at 9:45 am. **Classes missed because of inclement weather will be made up after two days are missed per class.**

E. Class Times and Days

F. Class Size and Teacher Ratio

Preschool 2 days has a 1-7 ratio. Preschool 3 days has a 1-8 ratio.
Jr. K has a 1-10 ratio.

G. Absences and Attendance

I. Arrival and Departure

For pick up we are asking caregivers to wait in front hallway, and the child will be released after visual contact of caregiver.

Notify the teacher in writing if there are any changes in who is authorized to take your child from the preschool. Pick up your child promptly at the end of the class. We will need identification for persons unknown to us.

J. Clothing

Since the child(ren) will be involved in a variety of activities, dress your child in washable sportswear. Outdoor clothing appropriate for ever-changing weather conditions is necessary. Closed-toe shoes are recommended for our playground. Children should gradually learn to manage their clothing without assistance. Teach your child(ren) to put on, zip, button, snap, and Velcro clothing to be worn at school.

K. Discipline

Part of training is that of self-control. We believe that busy, interested children seldom misbehave. Misbehavior will be handled by removing the child(ren) from the situation, clearly explaining the misbehavior, and discussing more appropriate behavior and / or respect for the rights of others. Children will be reassured of our love and concern when disciplined.

If misbehavior is severe, parents will be informed as soon as circumstances permit, and will be requested to discuss the misbehavior with their child(ren). If misbehavior persists, a consultation will be requested between parent and teacher. We do reserve the right to have child(ren) removed from our Preschool.

L. Fundraisers

Throughout the school year we have a few fundraisers. Your participation is very much needed and appreciated.

M. Parent / Teacher Conferences

Parent / Teacher conferences will be held in January and open to all families on an individual basis. Parent / Teacher conferences will be conducted as requested by a teacher or parent as needed throughout the year. Student assessments are done in September, January, and May.

N. Snacks

We ask all families to supply their own child with a nutritious, low-sugar snack. Table manners, social interaction in acceptable ways, and becoming acquainted with a variety of nutritious foods are some of the skills learned during snack time. **Please bring snack ready for your child to eat and a water bottle or cup for water.** Here are some suggestions for snack time:

Cheese sticks / slices

Yogurt / Gogurt

Crackers, Rice cakes

Apple / Berry sauces

Vegetables / Fruit cleaned, peeled, & cut if needed



Special treats for your child's birthday are welcome; however, they will need to be store bought and brought in an unopened package. A snack from your cultural background is also welcomed on this day for the class if it is also prepackaged.

O. Health and Wellness Policy

State guidelines require that we have only healthy children at school. Sick children should be kept home to prevent spreading germs to their classmates and teachers. Please have your child checked by your doctor if he / she has high fevers, rashes, stomach pains, ear infections, severe congestion, etc. Whenever a child has had a fever, keep him / her home for another 24 hours after the temperature has returned to normal. Children who are sent to school when they are not well are usually listless, cranky, and uncomfortable. **If you think your child is ill, do not send or bring him / her to school, even if he or she wants to come. Parents shall abide by the teacher's judgment if the teacher feels the child should be kept home or sent home.** Notify the school about **any** contagious disease your child has, such as measles, mumps, impetigo, chicken pox, pink eye, or COVID-19.

P. Medication Administration

If your child takes a medication, it must be administered before or after class by you. **Our staff will not administer medication.** If your child has allergies or asthma, please let us know and proper steps will be taken to ensure the safety of your child with the appropriate paperwork on file.

Q. Emergency Procedures

In case of sudden life-threatening illness or injury, we will call 911. You will be notified of the situation as soon as possible. ***Two emergency numbers must be on file on your child's registration form.*** If you or the person(s) listed cannot be reached and your child needs to be transported to the hospital, we will call an ambulance at the parent's expense. One staff person will accompany the child to the hospital.

In case of a community emergency such as a snowstorm or earthquake, we will keep your child at school until someone with proper authorization to pick him / her up arrives. If we need to evacuate our center for any reason, information will be available at our site. Concordia Christian Academy is our catastrophic emergency evacuation site.

We practice fire, earthquake, and lockdown drills.

R. Child Abuse, Neglect and Exploitation

Our school is required by law to report to the proper law enforcement agency any suspected or known child abuse, neglect, or exploitation.

S. Private Party Invitations

We ask that you do not have your child give out party invitations at school unless **everyone in child's class** is invited. Hurt feelings are inevitable if children in the class know they are not invited to a party.

T. Parent Participation

Parents may help prepare materials at home in advance for a teacher. We will not have parents come into the classroom to help.



Snack / Bathroom Time




